- Research and Practice Professional Development Grants: Open to all PCA&D faculty, including full-time, part-time, adjunct, and CCE. Examples of professional development supported by this grant include, but are not limited to, conference attendance and participation, research, travel, residencies, and publishing.

- Educator's Professional Development Grants: Open to all PCA&D faculty, including full-time, part-time, adjunct, and CCE. Examples of this grant funding include curriculum development, pedagogy, conference attendance and participation, workshops, and anything related to educational skill development. ### Next in the Main Gallery: Arte de La Borinqueña

PCA&D is excited to welcome *Arte de La Borinqueña*, the work of **Edgardo Miranda-Rodriguez**, with an opening reception on Tuesday, Jan. 17, from 5-8 pm in the Main Gallery with music, <u>Bomba dancing</u>, and more.

Miranda-Rodriguez is the creator of Puerto Rican superhero La Borinqueña, whose serialized comic amplifies and highlights the importance of telling stories about Puerto Rico's history, exploring present-day social issues and environmental issues, and celebrating the diversity of the Puerto Rican diaspora. La Borinqueña has become a real-life superhero, too, with a suite of graphic novels; a special anthology, *Ricanstruction*, benefiting grassroots organizations on the islands of Puerto Rico post-Hurricane Maria; partnerships with DC Comics, Chocolate Cortés, the Natural Resources Defense Council; and more.

A full slate of events for both the College community and beyond is planned for the duration of Arte de La Borinqueña, which will be held in the College's Main Gallery through March 10 — including a Family Superhero Day on Saturday, March 4. Stay tuned for more details!

### This week in the art world: New Nazca Lines discovered

A team of archaeologists from Yamagata University has discovered a new collection of 168 Nazca Lines in the deserts of southern Peru. These drawings are often monumental in scale and dot the Peruvian landscape, and many are only visible from the air. Known as geoglyphs, the largest measure about 1,200 feet across and depict humans, birds, killer orca whales, cats, and snakes. Scientists estimate they were created between 100 B.C.E. and 300 C.E.
