La Borinqueña, by Edgardo Miranda-Rodriguez

This week in the Gallery: Arte de La Borinqueña

PCA&D is excited to welcome *Arte de La Borinqueña*, the work of **Edgardo Miranda-Rodriguez**, with an opening reception tomorrow, Jan. 17, from 5-8 pm in the Main Gallery with music, <u>Bomba dancing</u>, and more.

Miranda-Rodriguez is the creator of Puerto Rican superhero La Borinqueña, whose serialized comic amplifies and highlights the importance of telling stories about Puerto Rico's history, exploring present-day social issues and environmental issues, and celebrating the diversity of the Puerto Rican diaspora. La Borinqueña has become a reallife superhero, too, with a suite of graphic novels; a special anthology, *Ricanstruction*, <u>benefiting grassroots organizations</u> on the islands of Puerto Rico post-Hurricane Maria; partnerships with DC Comics, Chocolate Cortés, the <u>Natural Resources</u> <u>Defense Council</u>; and more.

A full slate of events for the College community, and beyond, is planned for the duration of Arte de La Borinqueña, which will be held in the College's Main Gallery through March 10 — including a <u>Family Superhero Day</u> on Saturday, March 4.
