

As a real-life superhero, La Borinqueña has a suite of graphic novels, a special anthology, Ricanstruction, that benefits grassroots organizations on the islands of Puerto Rico post-Hurricane Maria; partnerships with DC Comics, Chocolate Cortés, the Natural Resources Defense Council; and more.
