



The College's food pantry for students has reopened for the Spring semester. It is open to all students, no questions asked. Where to find the fully stocked pantry? It's a beige two-door cabinet, located next to the Quiet Room in the CoLab. Shopping bags are stored to the left of the pantry. You'll find staples like canned soups and other ready-to-heat items, breakfast foods, pasta and sauce, potatoes, even personal care items like toothbrushes. Another resource to check out: Lancaster Central Market's After-Market program, which allows the public to select produce and prepared items that are near the end of their shelf life, free of charge. The program operates from 2:45-3:15 pm Tuesdays and Saturdays at the market, which is just off the center square — Penn Square — in Lancaster city, just a few blocks from campus. Bring your own bags, and select 3 to 5 items at first, returning to end of the line if you'd like to select more in a second turn.
