This week, Academic Affairs staff is holding advising sessions in the Learning Commons in preparation for fall class registration, which occurs next week. These advising sessions are drop-in, so no appointment is necessary, and are for students who will be juniors and seniors next fall (current Foundation students will have their own advising and registration: see next article).

The drop-in advising sessions will be held Wednesday, March 22, Thursday, March 23, and Friday, March 24, from 9 am to 6 pm each day in the Learning Commons.

How to be prepared: Print your unofficial transcript (found on Self Service) and use it to update your Academic Plan of Study (APS). If you need help, see How to Update Your <u>APS 2023</u> as a refresher. Any questions you have after doing your best to fill in your APS can be addressed during your advising session.

Registration will occur online through Self Service. The registration dates are:

Rising Seniors: Wednesday, March 29, 7 am

Rising Juniors: Thursday, March 30, at 7 am

Rising Sophomores: Friday, March 31 at 2 pm (group registration in The LookOut, see below)

By the end of the session, you'll be enrolled for the fall semester.

The addition of the iconic Black-eyed Susan accentuates the action and pays tribute to Maryland's most thrilling race."

1098-T tax forms now available

Your 1098-T form is now available. The College uses the ECSI company to process our 1098-T forms, so look for that name in the return address.

If you have not yet received your form in the mail, you may access an electronic copy of the 1098-T statement through the ECSI website (https://heartland.ecsi.net/). You will need your First and Last Name, Social Security Number, and the Zip Code that appears on your 1098-T form.

Food pantry is open for Spring semester

The College's food pantry is open to all students.

Where to find the fully stocked pantry? It's a beige two-door cabinet, located next to the Quiet Room in the CoLab. Shopping bags are stored to the left of the pantry. You'll find staples like canned soups and other ready-to-heat items, breakfast foods, pasta and sauce, potatoes, even personal care items like toothbrushes.

Another resource to check out: Lancaster Central Market's After-Market program, which allows the public to select produce and prepared items that are near the end of their shelf life, free of charge. The program operates from 2:45-3:15 pm Tuesdays and Saturdays at the market, which is just off the center square — Penn Square — in Lancaster city, just a few blocks from campus. Bring your own bags, and select 3 to 5 items at first, returning to end of the line if you'd like to select more in a second turn.
