By the end of the session, you'll be enrolled for the fall semester.

Diverse Voices Series: Noah Lewis visits Thursday

The Liberal Arts Department welcomes **Noah Lewis** as part of our Diverse Voices Speaker Series: "Searching for Identity" in the Atrium this Thursday, March 30, from 11:30 am to 12:30 pm. An actor and historian, Lewis is doing ancestry research of his own family when he discovered [the unique story of Ned Hector](#), an important African American who fought in the Revolutionary War. His undeniable affinity for Ned's story has led Lewis to portray Ned in Revolutionary War re-enactments and historical presentations.

Lewis embodies the character of Ned from the inside out. He revels and relives both the glory and pain of war, especially through the eyes of an African American man. From head to toe, his uniform and arms are precise and authentic. These elements blend to enhance Ned's riveting storytelling through Lewis, a story of a shared past, of where we come from and where we are today.

Highly recommended for all students, but especially for those interested in performance studies, theater and tech elements, LiveX, creative writing, and history. Don't miss this extraordinary opportunity to touch the past.

Four seniors' work recognized by Dieline

Work by four seniors in **Tom Newmaster's** Packaging Design Studio class — **Paige Alana Bowermaster**, **Tyler Handa**, **Frankie Reed**, and **Alex Serna** — recently was [highlighted in an edition of Dieline](#), a creative platform that serves the packaging community. As part of a class project, the four were charged with redesigning the packaging for four nationally known brands, and their results were impressive: The students' redesigns, if implemented, would result in increased sales of \$60 million for those brands. "Most art schools give assignments that are pretty pie-in-the-sky," Newmaster told Dieline. "Good instructors make them flex their muscles in other ways." CORE Gallery exhibition: *Essential Connection*



1098-T tax forms now available

Your 1098-T form is now available. The College uses the ECSI company to process our 1098-T forms, so look for that name in the return address.

If you have not yet received your form in the mail, you may access an electronic copy of the 1098-T statement through the ECSI website (<https://heartland.ecsi.net/>). To request your First and Last Name, Social Security Number, and the Zip Code that appears on your 1098-T form.

Food pantry is open for Spring semester

The College's food pantry is **open to all students**.

Where to find the fully stocked pantry? It's a beige two-door cabinet, located next to the Quiet Room in the CoLab. Shopping bags are stored to the left of the pantry. You'll find staples like canned soups and other ready-to-heat items, breakfast foods, pasta and sauce, potatoes, even personal care items like toothbrushes.

Another resource to check out: Lancaster Central Market's After-Market program, which allows the public to select produce and prepared items that are near the end of their shelf life, free of charge. The program operates from 2:45-3:15 pm Tuesdays and Saturdays at the market, which is just off the center square — Penn Square — in Lancaster city, just a few blocks from campus. Bring your own bags, and select 3 to 5 items at first, returning to end of the line if you'd like to select more in a second turn.
