The College's food pantry is open to all students. Quiet Room in the CoLab. Shopping bags are stored to the left of the pantry. You'll find staples like canned soups and other ready-to-heat items, breakfast foods, pasta and sauce, potatoes, even personal care items like toothbrushes. Another resource to check out: <u>Lancaster Central Market's After-Market program</u>, which allows the public to select produce and prepared items that are near the end of their shelf life, free of charge. The program operates from 2:45-3:15 pm Tuesdays and Saturdays at the market, which is just off the center square — Penn Square — in Lancaster city, just a few blocks from campus. Bring your own bags, and select 3 to 5 items at first, returning to end of the line if you'd like to select more in a second turn.
