Your input is sought for a survey on transportation corridors in Lancaster City that leave pedestrians and cyclists especially vulnerable. Several of them are in close proximity to the College — including North Prince Street directly in front of our campus — and your comments could be helpful in finding possible solutions. To complete the survey, <u>click here</u> or below. Zoom in on Lancaster on the map until you find a series of streets from Lemon down to King, along Prince, highlighted in red. Each is a "corridor". Click on a red line, and a box pops up with a link to "Submit Corridor Feedback." The College is especially concerned with our Prince/Chestnut intersection; low visibility around Water Street intersections; and the need for mid-block crosswalks. Call for Public Art: Lancaster Amtrak station

The City of Lancaster's Office of Public Art is inviting artists to create site-specific work to be displayed in two glass cases at the Lancaster Amtrak Train Station concourse. It's the second-busiest Amtrak station in the state, and the cases serve as a mode for celebrating local artists and arts organizations. Artwork must be original; subject matter and material are the artist's choice. Artists may apply as individuals or as groups, and finalists will be selected by a committee using a set of standardized criteria. Selected finalists will be interviewed by the Program Manager via a recorded remote meeting. The Public Art Advisory Board will make the ultimate selection of four artists/artist groups. The honorarium is \$750 per artist or artist group.

Call for Artists: Marietta Art Alive's Night Trees

Marietta Art Alive, the arts-in-action nonprofit team of Rivertownes PA, has issued a Call for Art for Night Trees, a juried exhibition inspired by the poem by Ruth Ann Meyers Kulp. Original 2-D work is sought (NO photography, digital art, commercial prints, or work created during a class, workshop, or online tutorial permitted). Diverse interpretations encouraged. A \$15 fee entitles artists to submit up to two pieces of work, and the deadline for entry is Oct. 2 at 8 pm. There will be two \$100 Juror's Choice Awards; two \$50 Honorable Mentions; and one \$50 People's Choice Award. Juror is **Tanis Garber-Shaw**.
