Faculty Life grant applications are now open

A new Faculty Grant cycle is now open for applications, and there are two kinds of opportunities open to all full-time, part-time, adjunct, and CCE faculty:

- The PCA&D Faculty Educator's Professional Development Grant provides supportive funding for the College's faculty participation in activities and events related to their professional development as an educator. Examples of this are (but are not limited to) curriculum development, pedagogy, conference attendance/participation, workshops, and anything relating to educational skill development.
- The PCA&D Faculty Research and Practice Professional Development Grant provides supportive funding for professional growth and development within a faculty member's field of interest. Examples of this are (but are not limited to) exhibition participation, research, travel, residency, and publishing.

Photographer Nancy Hellebrand visits PCA&D this Thursday for Artist Talk

The Foundation Department welcomes artist/photographer **<u>Nancy Hellebrand</u>** for an Artist Talk this Thursday, March 21, at 12:45 pm in the Atrium.

Everyone is welcome to attend the event. Hellebrand's work has been exhibited internationally, including the Museum of Modern Art, the International Center of Photography in New York, the National Museum of American Art, the Philadelphia Museum of Art, Tate Britain, Tate Liverpool, and the Barbican Centre in London. The National Portrait Gallery in London gave her a solo exhibition that was the first for an American artist and for a living woman.

CT&L Corner: The Guilt-Free Book Club

On March 7, we hosted our Guilt-Free Book Club on Sarah Rose Cavanagh's book, <u>Mind Over Monsters: Supporting Youth Mental Health with Compassionate Challenge</u>. Participants talked about their experiences navigating learning environments with unclear expectations, the tension between learning skills and learning agency, and balancing learning environments with support, structure, and challenge.

Further, based on discussions of navigating the critique process, with people communicating student anxiety/uncertainty over both giving and receiving critique, the CT&L has chosen a book ("<u>Let's Talk About Critique: Reimagining Art and Design</u> <u>Education</u>") as a future selection for the Guilt-Free Book Club. Through April 12, stop by the Mezzanine-level CORE Gallery (next to the elevators) to see *Show and Tell,* work by **Elizabeth Gregory** '25, Fine Art. The exhibition was curated by **Kayla Smith** '24, Fine Art. Gregory's artist statement, in part:

My body of work utilizes a patchwork of memories to crate eccentric narratives for viewers to interpret. Playing around with vibrant colors mixed with bizarre compositions and subjects gives the illusion that they are collaged with one another. The color palette I lean towards; the off-kilter lime green, holds major significance in my life. This was the color of my childhood bedroom for years, and just about everything that belonged to me was tagged with that lime green. The neon chokehold that kids who grew up in the early 2000s all had to experience defined a generation that I just fell victim to.
