The Board of Trustees is pleased to announce the appointment of **Audry K**. **Carter** to serve as the College's interim president throughout the presidential search process. Audry may be a familiar face to many of you, as she served as the Chair of the Board of Trustees from 2019-2022 and has been a member of the Board since 2016.

Board Chair **Russell D. Urban** noted that Audry "is the perfect candidate. She has the ability to transition seamlessly into this role, given her

extensive knowledge of the College."


Audry has a 40-year career of service in the nonprofit world, the majority of which was spent in higher education as a leader in philanthropy and public relations at institutions such as Boston University and Ohio Wesleyan University. Her active consulting practice, AQuire LLC, focuses on enhancing the efficiency and effectiveness of nonprofit organizations. She holds a BSFS degree in Foreign Service from Georgetown University and a nonprofit-focused MBA from Boston University.

Audry has stepped away from her role as a Trustee during this time while the College begins a national search for a new president. She will take on the day-to-day leadership responsibilities for the College until a new president is identified and hired. She will work closely with members of the Executive Cabinet to continue strengthening and expanding the College's key initiatives.

She noted, "my heart really is with PCA&D, which is what compelled me to say yes."

Audry plans to attend many campus events like the upcoming All-School Picnic, Commencement, and Senior Show. If you haven't met her yet, please introduce yourself.

"I look forward to serving in this new capacity on an interim basis," she said. "Together with a stellar leadership team, we won't miss a beat."

CT&L Corner: 'Let's Talk About Critique'

From **Dr. Adam Smith**, Director of the Center for Teaching & Learning and Manager of the Learning Commons:

If you strike up a conversation with me, I have an admittedly bad habit of bringing whatever I am reading into the discussion. Reading is a hobby, a

way I stay engaged at work/in my profession, and how I like to unwind. Just as much as I like reading, I like discussing what I'm reading.

This summer, our goal is to invite faculty into discussion on a core practice and art and design education: critique. Focusing on a recent text, <u>Let's Talk About Critique:</u> <u>Reimagining Art and Design Education</u>, we hope to engage participants in discussions of what's possible in critique. The book features a brief history of critique, a critique of critique, while the back half of the book features creative approaches to critique, written by practice artist-educators.

While I appreciate the feel of hardback/paperback, I've also recently experienced a new format of an online book club that uses a platform called <u>Perusall</u>. Using a digital text, participants can then annotate the text, creating threaded discussions that run along with the text. This allows readers to engage asynchronously while still stimulating discussions with peers.
