York's Work/Space hosts Annalisa Gojmerac

PCA&D's Work/Space, at 133 S. Duke St., York, welcomes artist **Annalisa Gojmerac**'s *Collective Inheritance* exhibition through Aug. 3. Featuring nature-based land art, *Collective Inheritance* has ties to local urban community gardening and nature place-making/greenscaping projects, making use of found objects as well as recycled materials. The exhibition will be open to the public during York First Friday, Aug. 1, from 5-9 pm, and at select other times to be determined. A traditionally trained printmaker, Gojmerac has a BFA from MICA with a major in printmaking and a minor in art history, and an MFA from Cranbrook Art and Architecture Academy, Detroit, with a major in printmaking and a minor in digital arts. Gojmerac was a founding member of. The Greening of Detroit, and currently is a founding member of York Fresh Food Farms Community Gardens.

Student health insurance info for 2025-26

The College is partnered with <u>QM Services (QMS)</u> for a lower-cost student health insurance plan (SHIP). The coverage includes a prescription plan, support for laboratory tests and X-rays, and inpatient and hospitalization coverage. QMS information will be shared with your student via email.

Students and families with qualifying health insurance will be able to opt out of this coverage. The opt-out process initially includes a charge to your College bill that will be removed once the waiver process has been completed. QMS will handle all records through its confidential portal. If coverage is initially declined through QMS, please reach out to Student Life at studentlife@pcad.edu so they may work with QMS partners to advocate for your health plan.

To opt out, log onto the <u>QMS website</u> to submit proof of insurance. If you're having issues with the website portal, connect with PCA&D's independent student health

insurance administrators at <u>university@qmservicesinc.com</u>. The College's Student Life team will be emailing more summer communications that offer an overview of health and wellness resources available to your student during the academic year. Important information about the fall tuition bill

Your student's tuition statement is now available through their MyPCAD account. Use this link to access it. This statement will be subject to change due to adjustments in your student's class schedule, if you opt for student health insurance, housing, a meal block plan, parking, or if your student requires materials for their classes. Review the statement for accuracy. If you have questions about financial aid eligibility, scholarships, or grants, contact Vincent Frank, Director of Financial Aid, at finaid@pcad.edu. The first payment for the Fall 2025 semester is due Aug. 1.

Students MUST sign their financial agreement

A reminder that the MANDATORY Student Financial Responsibility Agreement (SFRA) is due by Friday, Aug. 15. It ensures your student understands the College's billing process and procedures. If your student fails to sign it by the deadline, their Fall 2025 classes will be dropped and they will be unable to move into PCA&D-sponsored housing. They can access the SFRA in several ways:

From MyPCAD:


- 1. Log into MyPCAD at <u>ss.pcad.edu/</u>. If you are locked out or unable to log in, contact the IT Department at <u>it@pcad.edu</u> or call 800-689-0379 ext. 1004.
- 2. Click the Finances tab.
- 3. Select "Student Financial Responsibility Agreement"
- 4. Read the agreement, sign electronically, and click the Save button
- 5. Click the Next button in upper right, and then Finish
- 6. Your student will receive an email at the email address they entered at sign-in. Print and keep the email for your records.

From Student Portal:

- 1. Navigate to the portal at pcad.edu/student-portal
- 2. Select the Student Financial Responsibility Agreement tile

- 3. Read the agreement, sign electronically, and click the Save button
- 4. Click the Next button in upper right, and then Finish
- 5. You will receive an email at the email address you entered at sign-in. Print and keep the email for your records.

Lee addressed the technical production; Schaufele recorded a video on how the space was used; and Henderson described the live performance art component and how it relates

to reclaiming the posture portrait/being seen, and led participants through a postural dance exercise.
