Call for Art: Lancaster Amtrak station

The City of Lancaster Office of Public Art seeks artists to showcase work in two glassenclosed display cases at the Lancaster Amtrak Train Station. Create site-specific work inspired by or cohesive with the *A Place for Every Piece: Lancaster's Living Quilt* design.

Artists are encouraged to submit proposals for installations in the glass cases that either draw from or align with that work, by Libby Modern and Jill Good, which will fill windows in the station's main terminal. Proposals should include drawings, sketches, or renderings, along with a written description. While new, site-specific works are preferred, artists may adapt previous artworks, to fit the theme of *A Place for Every Piece: Lancaster's Living Quilt.*

This call is open to all professional artists and artist teams ages 18 and older. Each selected artist or team will receive a \$1,250 honorarium to cover project expenses, including materials, fabrication, and installation.
