Great expectations and growth mindsets

You may have heard this story: a teacher is told that their students have above-average IQs, and the teacher engages with their class, with above-average results. The teacher is later told that, in fact, their students were an average (re: mixed ability) group. The self-fulfilling prophecy of positive expectations leading to positive outcomes came to

be known as the Pygmalion effect (after the George Bernard Shaw work, which was later adapted into the musical, *My Fair Lady*).

In subsequent decades, this research has been replicated with varying degrees of success...

RAVE text alert system will be tested today



'Threads of Legacy' projection this weekend

This Friday and Saturday, Jan. 17-18, don't miss *Threads of Legacy*, a projection on the Atrium windows featuring the work of Photography and Video majors **Kiri Chhun** and **Ashley Vazquez**. Each artist explores themes of heritage, memory, and the enduring bonds of family. Chhun's video reflects their journey of rediscovering family history and navigating Cambodian American identity, blending a personal poem, evocative imagery, and music to illuminate the resilience of cultural roots. Vazquez's *Annie's Hymn* draws on her mother's Polaroids and a poetic narration to honor maternal love and the spiritual strength carried through life's challenges, creating a meditation on memory and legacy. Together, these works invite viewers to reflect on their own connections to heritage and the threads that tie us to those who came before.

As an Art Juror, you're asked to commit to a one-day panel this Wednesday, Jan. 15, from 10 am to 12:30 pm Judging will be done in person at PCA&D. The adjudication process is the core of the recognition programs. Jurors look for works that exemplify the Awards' core values: originality, technical skill, and the emergence of personal voice or vision.

Call for Art: Lancaster Amtrak station

The City of Lancaster Office of Public Art seeks artists to showcase work in two glassenclosed display cases at the Lancaster Amtrak Train Station. Create site-specific work inspired by or cohesive with the *A Place for Every Piece: Lancaster's Living Quilt* design.

Artists are encouraged to submit proposals for installations in the glass cases that either draw from or align with that work, by Libby Modern and Jill Good, which will fill windows in the station's main terminal. Proposals should include drawings, sketches, or renderings, along with a written description. While new, site-specific works are preferred, artists may adapt previous artworks, to fit the theme of *A Place for Every Piece: Lancaster's Living Quilt*.

This call is open to all professional artists and artist teams ages 18 and older. Each selected artist or team will receive a \$1,250 honorarium to cover project expenses, including materials, fabrication, and installation.
