Faculty grant cycle opens for Fall 2024

It's time for Fall 2024 faculty grant applications! Please read over the two types of grants offered at PCA&D, and see if any of your ongoing or upcoming practice fits the definition.

• Research & Practice Professional Development Grants provide supportive funding for professional growth and development within a PCA&D faculty member's field of interest. All PCA&D faculty are eligible to apply for this grant: adjunct, part-time, full-time, and CCE faculty. Examples of professional development supported by this grant (not limited to) include conference attendance, conference participation, research, travel, residency, publishing, etc.

• Educator's Professional Development Grants provide supportive funding for PCA&D faculty participation in activities and events relating to a faculty member's professional development as an educator. All PCA&D faculty are eligible to apply for this grant: adjunt, part-time, full-time, and CCE faculty. Examples of this grant are (not limited to) curriculum development, pedagogy, conference attendance/participation, workshops, anything related to educational skill development.

The Pennsylvania-based Stabin says he avoided writing as long as he could -- but eventually got over that "emotional hump': Writing, Stabin says, "helps

grab larger audiences, storytelling is an undeniable hook. Writing and visualizing can only make us stand out as unique individuals. I am interested in sharing my personal journey, and have students learn from my mistakes!"

Painter Peter Van Dyck visits Oct. 25 for Artist Talk

The Fine Art Department on Friday, Oct. 25, welcomes guest speaker **Peter Van Dyck**. The entire College community is invited to attend his Artist Talk, from 12:45 - 1:45 pm in the LookOut.

Van Dyck says he approaches all his subjects the same way, whether they be landscape, still-life, or interior. And they often capture the interplay and blend any dividing line between "here" and "over there", between interior and exterior, or the way objects relate to one another.

A teacher of painting and drawing, Van Dyck works primarily in oils. He divides his time between


Philadelphia and Elba, Alabama. He studied at, and taught at, the Florence Academy of Art in Italy, and has taught painting at the Pennsylvania Academy of the Fine Arts.

Documentary featuring Matt Novak screening at PCA&D

Matt Novak (Assistant Professor, AGA) is excited to announce he's part of a new documentary about Walt Disney Feature Animation Florida, which will screen for the College community and the public on Nov. 8 at 6 pm in the Atrium.

Novak worked there as an animation artist from 1989-1992, and "Beyond the Glass: The WDW Animation Building", directed by **Dane Tankesley** and available on YouTube, covers the origins and demise of the Florida Studio that was a division of Walt Disney Feature Animation that operated from 1989-2004. Its offices were part of the backlot of the Disney MGM Studios theme park and visitors were allowed to tour the studio to observe animators at work. The division is best known for producing *Mulan, Lilo & Stitch*, and *Brother Bear*.

The new documentary is filled with footage and interviews from numerous animators who worked at the Disney-MGM Studios' Magic of Disney Animation attraction, and the working studio showcased there.

Plan to attend the screening and learn about this rare moment in Disney Studios history and have a chance to speak with Novak and director Tankesley.








New *Into the Darkroom* episode: Rasha Clark
