The fantasy of frictionless learning: on Al and 'desirable



#### difficulties'

Recently, I met with some Foundation Year students to talk about taking notes, studying, and critical reading. I'm happy to do these visits, as they're one of my few opportunities to interact with students within their coursework. I started by asking how many of them had been "taught" how to take notes in any substantive way: each class was roughly 50/50. We talked about the benefits of taking notes on paper versus the laptop. All of our discussion

assumed that they were in fact taking their own notes (and not using AI the way many of us do in administrative meetings). Elsewhere, I asked some students what percentage of their classmates they knew (or thought) used Generative AI (such as ChatGPT or related programs that can summarize their assigned readings) in class, and they sheepishly guessed 80%... for many reasons, I'm not surprised by this statistic, but I'm not encouraged by it either. I value authentic learning, and I know that learning comes with some amount of inherent friction...

# Artist Talk: Jongsung Paul Choe visits PCA&D Thursday

Photographer **Jongsung Paul Choe** joins PCA&D for an Artist Talk this Thursday, Feb. 20, in the Atrium.

Dean of the College of Arts and Professor at Kyungil University, South Korea, Choe didn't begin his university career studying art: instead, he planned to attend medical school. But taking a photography class "was like meditation," he said, and he eventually ended up taking photos of larger issues that interested him, issues such as self-examination, emotional conflicts, and self-struggles. While he was staying in the U.S. or in Korea, he said, "I want(ed) to show my personal emotions through ... larger issues to make them more understandable. I want to express myself and the issues arising through the society."

#### Judges needed for MADCom creative contest

Help inspire and support the next generation of design and media professionals by helping to judge MADCom, the Media and Design Competition. This virtual judging opportunity takes place during the week of March 31-April 4, and is part of the Center for Creative Exploration's partnership with our Intermediate Unit (Lancaster-Lebanon IU13). Each year, IU13's Educational Technology team hosts the regional MADCom, open to middle and high school students, in six categories; judges are especially needed in 3D Design Task:

**3D Design Task:** Create an environmentally friendly device for your community, school, or home that would solve a problem, issue, or support a device to be more efficient. Design your solution using 3D design software. Include images in your presentation with labels that show the features of your design as detailed in your solution description. Students should display their final 3D print and are encouraged to be creative in how they display the design (draw/color environment, include toy people, cars, etc) to display how it would be placed within the community.

Winners in each category advance to the state competition, held in May at Elizabethtown College.

Here's how the process works:

- Project Submission: Students will submit their projects to an online dashboard by March 25
- Virtual Judging: Judging will take place virtually during the week of March 31–April

- Student Showcase (Optional to Attend): On April 8, from 9–11 am, they are
  hosting a Student Showcase at the IU Training & Conference Center (located
  at 1020 New Holland Ave.). Judges are welcome to attend to interact with
  students and view their projects up close.

#### City opens Neighborhood Art Project residencies


