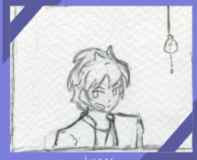

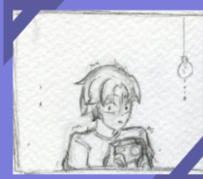
OLIVIA

Faculty Life grant applications due next Monday

Two types of Faculty Life grants have now been opened for Spring 2025 applications. The two types are explained below, and **the application deadline for both grants is next Monday, March 31**. All PCA&D faculty are eligible to apply for these grants: adjunct, part-time, full-time, and CCE faculty.

Educators Professional Development Grant: Link to guidelines, more information, and to apply [here](#). Examples of this include, but are not limited to, curriculum development, pedagogy, conference attendance/participation, workshops, and anything relating to educational skill development.

Research & Practice Professional Development Grant: Link to guidelines, more information, and to apply [here](#). Examples of professional development supported by this grant include, but are not limited to, conference attendance, conference participation, research, travel, residency, and publishing.

Those receiving professional development funds will report back and present on the experience and outcomes of their faculty development activities. The scope and nature of this presentation will reflect the activity funded.

Alex Leonhart presenting at conference

Alex Leonhart, Director of Aesthetic Technologies and Chair of LiveX, will present at the [NarraScope conference](#) at Drexel University this June. The conference focuses on the topics of ludonarrative game design studies. As Leonhart explains: "...ludo(game)-narrative(story) design is a subsection of game studies that looks at how play and story interrelate. Often, this is looked at from a core mechanics/game systems perspective and if that meshes well with the storytelling. Everything from character capabilities, environmental navigation, and interactive systems and their relationships to the overall and subnarratives. We can use the lenses of mechanics, dynamics, and/or aesthetics when doing a critical analysis of the stories of games."

In the movie, Fujino befriends a "shut-in," Kyomoto, out of a mutual admiration for each other's manga drawing and (visual) storytelling. CCE faculty: Two-factor email authentication

A note for CCE faculty: If you did not update your PCA&D email account to turn on two-factor authentication, you will likely not be able to log into your account. If this is something that you planned to do but didn't get around to, you can reach out to the IT department to help you get your account back up and running.
