New Main Gallery exhibition opens Friday

Pennsylvania College of Art & Design welcomes a new Main Gallery exhibition at the end of this week, highlighting PCA&D's commitment to educating not only our students but also our faculty in the pursuit of lifelong learning and professional development. The seven exhibiting artists have received grants from the College to attend residencies or courses where work was produced or new skills and techniques were learned. The artwork on view is a result of those experiences, either created at the time or through applying what they learned to new work.



Atrium renovation time is almost here!

In just a week, renovations to the College's Atrium space get underway!

Until mid-August, we'll be undertaking a major (and long-awaited!) Atrium refresh under the design guidance of Tippetts/Weaver Architects, and the management of Benchmark Construction. A few highlights: reimagining the current stairwell to the Mezzanine level to including a seating wall; the addition of two new "social pods" for students to meet up at the top of the stairs; the inclusion of retractable hanging scrims that may be used to separate parts of the Atrium or as projection screens to animate the space; and new flooring. It's a big change from the current space, and we're excited to see how our student body enlivens the space when classes get started this August! The Tippetts/Weaver schematic above should give you a basic idea of the final plans.
