Applications are now open for 2025-26 PCA&D's Career Development Fellowship Program, a paid one-year post-baccalaureate program that supports continued professional and creative development of recent BA or BFA graduate(s) from the Class of 2024 or Class of 2025. The program guides Fellows in the development of their entrepreneurial and career skills, provides art and non-art workplace learning

opportunities, assists in the continued development of their craft and creative practice, and supports the advanced development of portfolios for potential graduate study.

Fellows obtain experience in three key areas: The Design Workplace, The Community Workplace, and The Creative Practice. Through The Design Workplace, Fellows lead an undergraduate design team to provide design, film, and other creative services to PCA&D and the larger Central Pennsylvania community.

Time management, source references, and avoid commission scams workshops start today

Three Spring Learning Commons Workshops will be held with PCA&D Alumni Mentor **Joanna Becker** -- attend one, two, or all three, depending on the topics you want to explore! The programs start today, and each runs from 3:30-4:30 pm in the Learning Commons:

• TODAY, March 31: Time Management Toolkit -- Find the Method that Works for You! There's only so much time in a day -- or week -- to get all your assignments, tasks, and work finished. If you find that time constantly gets away from you, or that you're struggling to manage procrastination, this workshop aims


- to give you strategies and tools that can be adapted to your needs. There are a variety of methods, from digital apps and approaches to traditional journals and analog agendas. Come engage in this low-stress workshop geared at easing stress caused by a cluttered schedule -- and get personal feedback that can help you get back on track!
- April 7: Sourcing Art References -- Public Domain Resources. It can be
 difficult to find the right kinds of reference material for your art. As our digital world
 is becoming more and more dominated by Al images and visual clutter, the ability
 to search for what you need (and the skill of checking proper usage rights for
 images) is becoming a chore. Dive into the realm of photographic databases and
 web archives with this workshop about art reference gathering -- and get insight
 on how to use your reference as inspiration for your next artistic masterpiece!
- April 14: How to Spot Fake Clients and Job Opportunities -- Avoiding Scams. As you begin posting your art online and displaying your portfolio on social sites, be aware that college students and recent grads are prime targets for commission scams. Even seasoned artists will get fake client inquiries, so being able to spot these common signs is a skill that will be useful for years to come. In this workshop, we will go over the tactics scammers use, as well as examples of what to look for. Since these scams evolve, it is also useful to know how to verify a client and cross-reference company mastheads (especially when a job offer appears too good to be true).


This Friday! Art Market takes over the College


"I believe Pennsylvania College of Art & Design is going to be a player in the art and design world, writ large in the nation," Barnes noted.

Returning? Remember your 5/1 FAFSA deadline

A message from Director of Financial Aid & Student Employment Vincent Frank:

This is a friendly reminder that the deadline for Pennsylvania residents to apply for Financial Aid for the 2025-26 school year is May 1. If you have not already done this, please do so immediately at <u>studentaid.gov</u>.

This is especially urgent for Pennsylvania residents because the FAFSA must be submitted by May 1 in order to be considered for the Pennsylvania State Grant. The PA

State Grant is worth up to \$5,750, which is free money that does not need to be repaid. If you complete the FAFSA *after* May 1, you will automatically be ineligible for the PA State Grant for the entire 2025-26 academic year.

If you do not receive the PA State Grant as a result of missing the filing deadline, please be aware that PCA&D will be unable to replace it with institutional grants.

Several states and U.S. territories (including Delaware, Ohio, West Virginia, Washington, D.C., and Vermont) have reciprocity with Pennsylvania, meaning their state grants may be used at Pennsylvania schools. If you reside in one of those locations, you will need to check with your state's or territory's grant agency for deadlines and other details.

1098-T Tuition Statement information

When you're completing your 2024 taxes, you'll need your 1098-T Tuition Statement. A reminder that, if you provided electronic consent to the College by Jan. 1, 2025, you have access to those forms via myPCAD. This is in partnership with the company ECSI. If your electronic consent was not received by that date, the form will be mailed to the current address on file. Please update your address with the Registrar's Office if an address change is needed.
